Traveling to and from Africa recently entailed flying on 10 different airplanes and many hours of sitting. Amazingly, I made all the necessary connections, and I am grateful for traveling mercies!

I was blessed to travel with Bishop Jim Dunlop, his wife Connie, and the Rev. Cliff Eschbach on behalf of the Lower Susquehanna Synod. They have all previously traveled to visit our partners in the Konde Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania, so I was the able to benefit from their experience and previously established relationships. We covered a fair amount of ground in the Konde Diocese, visiting with the bishop, staff, pastors and other leaders in the church. We also visited a number of institutions under the Konde Diocese umbrella, including schools, hospitals, and a beach side conference center.

The visit with our brothers and sisters in Christ in Tanzania brought home the wonder of Paul's words to the Corinthians: "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the Spirit we were all baptized into one body – Jews or Greeks, slaves or free – and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed the body does not consist of one member but of many." (1 Cor. 12:12-14)

Like Lutherans in Manheim and central Pennsylvania, Lutherans in the Konde Diocese trace their heritage to the German Lutheran church and to the work of German Lutheran missionaries. Today the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania is dynamic and growing and is one of the largest Lutheran church bodies in the world.

As the chair of the Konde Diocese Committee of the Lower Susquehanna Synod, I am blessed to help steward our relationship with our brothers and sisters in Christ in that corner of Tanzania. There is much we can learn from the vibrant faith and worship of the church there, and there is much we can do together in prayer, resource sharing and mission. The church in the US is very different from the church in Tanzania, but we are one in Christ, and that is worth celebrating!

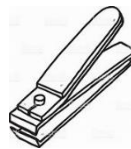

LWR Personal Care Kits Needed

Cleanliness may not be next to godliness, but it certainly helps a person feel more human. When families find their homes destroyed, or must flee for their safety, soap and a towel rarely make the cut for what they can carry. Arriving in a refuge camp or other place of safety, they are scared, vulnerable, and dirty from the travel. The simple items included in a personal care kit provide much needed self-care, critical germ-fighting, and the chance to regain dignity amidst situations of fear and uncertainty.

This year, we are accepting purchased items to assemble in the kits. They may be placed in the box outside of the church office. **(Please take note of the requested size of each item. If they do not meet the size requirement, they cannot be used for the kits.)** Requested items include:

- *Light-weight bath-size towels
(between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27") in dark colors
- *Bath-size bars of gentle soap
(4 or 5oz. in original wrapping)
- *Adult size toothbrushes
(if buying in bulk, toothbrushes need packaged in individual envelopes)
- *Metal nail clippers
(attached file optional)



Monetary donations will also be accepted for the kits. Donations can be placed in your church envelope and marked "personal care kits" in the memo line. The last day for collection will be August 27th. We will assemble the kits in September (*dates to be announced later*).

We need someone to deliver the kits to Bergstrasse Lutheran Church on Sat., October 7th between 8:30-11:00am. If you could do this, please call Kelly Barthold at 717-810-6330.

Building Relationships with Zion Lutheran Preschool

Thanks to Deb Gehman and Betty Wise for serving as Zion’s representatives on the Preschool board. At our July board meeting, we discussed ways to continue to build relationships between the Preschool and the congregation. In the past few years, we have implemented the Christmas tree decorating event, the Easter egg hunt, and a weekday, morning Christmas program. All of these have been well received outreach and service events.

We decided to move ahead with two specific additional ideas, which means we will need your help and participation. With an eye to the beginning of the school year, we talked about an opening convocation and blessing service. We concluded that a Saturday morning event/blessing service with light refreshments would be the best approach. This works well with my sense that we need to develop a “parallel track” of ministry and worship opportunities geared specifically to young families. Watch for the date announcement and other details related to this event as we look forward to the new preschool year.

The second idea we discussed was opportunities for faith formation with preschool kids. Beginning this year, we will try “Lunch Bunch with Pastor Kate” during the school day. This will give me a chance to interact with the kids, to share a story and prayers, and to learn together. Working with preschool kids will be new to me and I would like to amend the lunch bunch idea to be “Pastor Kate and Friends!” I would welcome a small group of Zion members with a heart for kids to join me in reading bible stories and sharing time with the preschool little ones. Talk to me if you are interested. Initially, I am thinking that the lunch bunch gathering would happen twice a month, possibly on Wednesdays.

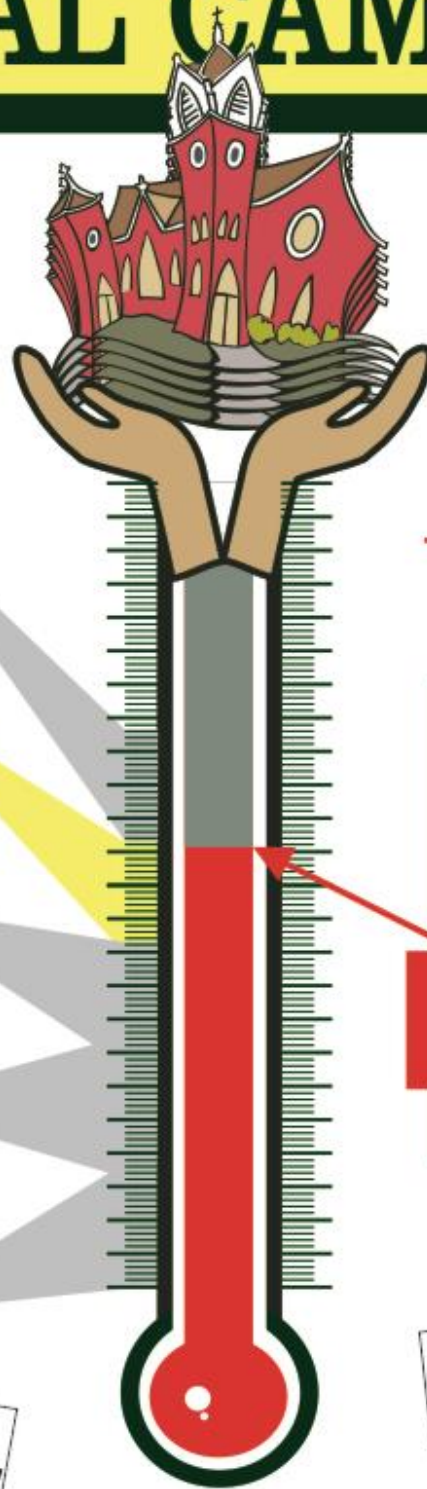


Finally, join me in continued prayers for our preschool ministry! And let the little children come, that we might share God’s love with them!

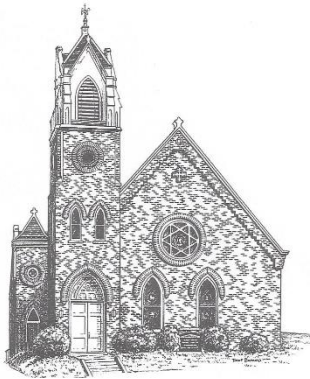


Prayer Chain
