> O holy night! the stars are brightly shining; It is the night of the dear Savior's birth. Long lay the world in sin and error pining, Till He appeared and the soul felt its worth. A thrill of hope- the weary world rejoices, For yonder breaks a new and glorious morn! Fall on your knees! O hear the angel voices! O night divine, O night when Christ was born! Advent is a season marked by anticipation and preparation as we look to that holy night when Christ was born. In a culture oversaturated with commercial preparations for Christmas, Advent-keeping remains a deeply counter-cultural practice, and an opportunity to dwell for a set apart time in the light of God's promises.

Our Advent theme this year references one of the lines from the hymn O Holy Night. For 4 Sundays, beginning November 26, we will explore the question **"How Does a Weary World Rejoice?"** With this theme, we acknowledge our own weariness, and the hope we have in the gift of Emmanuel, God with us.

We'll be keeping the Advent season at Zion a bit out of sync with the liturgical calendar this year. Advent is appointed to begin on Dec. 3, with the fourth and final Sunday of Advent on



December 24. In order to fully engage our Advent theme and to fully prepare the way of the Lord at Zion throughout the season of Advent, Zion will begin Advent worship on November 26, as noted above. This means that all services on December 24 will be worship for Christmas Eve. Christmas Eve worship will take place at 10:30 am and 7 pm -- please note the change of time for morning worship!

How does a weary world rejoice? Let the answer be: together, in the light of God's love this Advent season.

(If the weather is bad, we may shift the craft tables and refreshments indoors and/or have the preschool kids decorate the tree at a later date).

All are welcome to come and join the fun, and to help decorate the outdoor tree.

Annual Congregational Meeting Set

Our annual congregational meeting is scheduled for Sunday, December 3rd. We will be voting on the proposed 2024 budget and election of new Council members. We will also be voting on a proposal to change some wording in the by-laws of the Special

Gifts and Bequests Committee. (Please see next page with related info.) Please plan to attend.

Special Gifts and Bequests Fund: Proposed Bylaw Amendment

An agenda item to be addressed at Zion's Annual meeting on Dec. 3rd concerns the process of allocating the interest income from the Special Gifts and Bequests Fund. The following by-law, with the noted procedures and percentages for disbursements of SGB Funds, was adopted in 2006:

The COMMITTEE shall determine what is principal and interest according to accepted accounting procedures.

Gifts and bequests to the FUND shall accumulate until principal amount of \$25,000 is achieved, after which the interest generated from the investment of the principal shall be expended.

Interest from the FUND shall be distributed annually and such other times as deemed necessary and/or feasible to accomplish any of the following purposes:

- 1. "Seminary Scholarships" 30%
- 2. "Scholarships for Zion's Youth and Adults" 30%
- 3. "Local and Wider Church Benevolence" 30%
- 4. "Capital Improvements for Zion's Nursery Preschool" 10% This would include playground equipment, facility repairs or improvements, and other long-term improvements, if needed. If not all of the interest credited for this purpose is expended annually, the remainder of the funds may be accumulated within the fund, or may be assigned for purpose #3, "Local and Wider Church Benevolence".

Programs for support shall be recommended by the COMMITTEE and approved by the Church Council for funding.

In order to give the Special Gifts and Bequests Fund Committee greater discretion and flexibility for disbursement of monies from the Fund, the Church Council, at the request of the Committee, proposes to eliminate the percentage allocations and to replace the bold section with the following amendment:

Interest from the FUND shall be distributed annually and such other times as deemed necessary and/or feasible at the discretion of the FUND Committee, to support any of the following purposes: local and wider community ministries; spiritual formation and leadership development opportunities for youth and adult members; and the Zion Lutheran Preschool.






