Dear Friends,

As I look ahead to the month of March and on, into spring, the theme of the season is "MAYBE."

Will we return to in-person worship anytime soon? Maybe.

Will the weather allow for outdoor worship? Maybe.

Will I be able to be vaccinated before the summer? Maybe.

Will I be able to see and hug my loved ones soon? Maybe.

Will the coronavirus variants be an issue? Maybe.

Is the end of the covid pandemic drawing nearer? Maybe.

We continue to live in a season of maybe, and this makes planning for the future a huge challenge. (Not to mention, exhausting!)

"Living with maybe" means that we are not planning too far ahead in this season here at Zion. In particular I want to note that we have not yet made final plans for Holy Week and Easter, but will offer updated details and plans later in March.

While the number of covid-19 cases and deaths have decreased significantly in Lancaster County in recent weeks, the county is still in a dangerously high risk category for transmission of the disease. The goal (per synod guidelines) is less than a 5% positivity rate, when the number of new infections is 20 per 100,000. Since we are moving in the right direction countywide, I am hopeful we may soon consider a return to in-person worship, but we want to do so with care and prayer! Further discussion about the status of in-person gatherings at Zion will take place at the council meeting on March 8.

In the meantime, we continue to hold fast to the good news. "As surely as God is faithful, our word to you has not been "Yes and No." For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, whom we proclaimed among you... was not "Yes and No"; but in him it is always "Yes." For in him every one of God's promises is a "Yes." For this reason it is through him that we say the "Amen," to the glory of God." (2 Cor. 1:18-20)

Live-streaming of Morning Prayer continues on Zion's facebook page, Monday – Friday at 9:15, with Art and Music Video devotionals on Fridays.


We will be offering a pre-recorded video of Holden Evening Prayer for Lent later in March.

As the Zion Lutheran Preschool marks 51 years of educational ministry, we continue to look for ways to strengthen and grow the relationship between the congregation and the families we serve in Manheim. This has been especially challenging in the 2020-2021 school year, given all the covid restrictions.



In order to share the good news about Jesus at Easter with Preschool families this year, we would like to offer the gift of "This is Easter" to the 70 families with children in the preschool. 
