According to the calendar of the church year we are currently in the season of ordinary time. The idea of ordinary time actually comes from the word "ordinal," meaning counted. In ordinary time, we count, in ordinal numbers (1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc), the Sundays after Epiphany and the Sundays after Pentecost.

In the church year, ordinary time contrasts with the intentionally reflective character of Advent and Lent, and the celebratory nature of Christmas and Easter. Ordinary time is the longest season in the liturgical year, spanning 33 or 34 weeks (depending on the dates for Easter and Advent). The season is marked by the liturgical color of green, and the scripture readings in this season explore themes from Jesus' ministry and his call to discipleship in everyday life.

The sense of "ordinary" as commonplace or familiar resonates with me. Our God is a God present in the ordinary. God came down to earth and lived among us in the ordinary human flesh of a man named Jesus. God is present in ordinary water, bread and wine when we celebrate the sacraments of baptism and holy communion. Where 2 or 3 are gathered, God is present, and Jesus promised to be with us always – including in all the ordinary times and places of our lives. We are called to do no extraordinary things, but to live in faith, active in love, in the day-to-day routines of our ordinary lives. Spoiler alert: by the power of God's Spirit at work within and around us, the ordinary becomes holy and gracious.

On Sunday mornings this summer I've been saying that ordinary time is a good time to celebrate God's extraordinary grace and love. It's a good time, too, to share God's love and grace with others. May our eyes and ears be open to the ways God is with us as we live and share in faith in this season of ordinary time!

#### **LWR Personal Care Kits Needed**


A number of folks have talked to me about being a part of this ministry, and I am grateful.

We are scheduled to open on September 11<sup>th</sup> and would appreciate you keeping us in your prayers as we get closer to our start date!



Dear Friends of Zion,

I would like to thank you for the cards, thoughts and prayers, phone calls, and words of concern as I struggled with a neurological problem for the past 18 months. You will never know how your care sustained and uplifted me when I needed it most.

After many appointments and consultations, doctors agree that I do not have normal Parkinson's Disease, and therefore I am not able to have deep brain stimulation surgery. I do have a "parkinsonism" which is a neurological condition that mimics Parkinson's, but for which there is no treatment or cure. Whether it is Progressive Supranuclear Palsy is unknown as these diseases can only be identified by a brain autopsy. I do have left side weakness — and I am left-handed — and balance issues. Sadly, I am no longer able to send cards back to you.

For now, I am trying to live with grace and exercise as much as possible to maintain the mobility I still have. Hopefully, I will be able to continue to attend in=person worship. Please know that I am extremely thankful for your ministry of care to me.


