
THE LORD'S PRAYER



Overview of the Readings for the Sixth Sunday of Easter Invited into Friendship

Ask any child who has moved to a new place and they will probably confirm that their biggest worry was if they'd make new friends. Parents worry for their teenager and young adult in each stage of growth, wondering if new friends will be kind and generous, if their daughter or son will find mutually beneficial relationships. Adults are not immune from their own relationship trials. Busy lives, competing priorities, transitions and death can mean the end of sustaining relationships. Bullying, feartactics and misuse of others are common problems, so friendship is precious. We treasure new friendships and work to keep tending those that last for many years because we need them.

Today's readings inspire and compel us to love one another and see one another as God does. As the Holy Spirit falls on those outside the inner circle of the circumcised, Peter asks how the water of baptism can be withheld. In 1 John we hear that those who love the parent love the child. Jesus says followers are no longer servants but friends. So whether they are a stranger with different customs and practices, our family member, or closest friend, we are called today with the challenge and opportunity to love them. The promise is that this unconditional love that comes first from our Creator and Parent, expressed through the person of Jesus and through the Spirit, is splashed all over us, and will make our joy complete.

For those who have experienced great relationships in their lives and for those who have never yet quite tasted that sustaining fruit, Jesus shows how much he loves us and the ways to cultivate deeper relationships. Jesus laid down his life to show his great love. We're invited to love expansively and experience the joy of friendship with Jesus and through the body of Christ.

The Readings on This Day Sixth Sunday of Easter

Today is the 36th day of Easter. (Ascension Day is this coming Thursday, the 40th day of Easter). We continue to celebrate the meaning of the resurrection.

John 15:9-17

We continue through John 15. The command to love takes the form of a sign in the footwashing of Maundy Thursday. The crucified and risen Christ enables us to live in such love. This passage includes an emphasis on joy and introduces the language of being a friend of God. We are so accustomed to this language that we lose the shock of the divinity calling humankind friends. The command to love in Mark 12 will be the reading on November 1, often celebrated as All Saints Day.

Acts 10:44-48

How to experience the resurrection of Christ? Receive the Holy Spirit and be baptized. The order of events in this narrative has given support to those churches that understand baptism as only a ritual that confirms one's belief, thus "believer's baptism." Apparently in the 80s CE, some Christians were baptizing "in the name of Jesus Christ" and others in the name of the Trinity; this difference continues today.

1 John 5:1-6

This reading complements the gospel from John by repeating an emphasis on love but also by placing "children" alongside "friends." The truth of each term balances the other.

Psalm 98

We respond to the narrative of the Gentiles receiving the Holy Spirit by reciting Psalm 98. Also appointed for Christmas Day, Psalm 98 is an exuberant hymn in which we, with "all the ends of the earth," praise the victory of Christ's resurrection. Psalm 98 inspired the hymn "Joy to the World," but the psalm is wonderfully appropriate for Easter as well as Advent/Christmas.
